Early Learning Program (ELP): Provides family-centered, home-based services to promote the development of children from birth to three years of age. Services include developmental screening and assessment, occupational, physical, and speech therapy, specialized instruction, plus service coordination and other individualized services.

Children's Mental Health Program (CMH): Comprehensive mental health services to children and families including comprehensive psychological assessments and individual, family and group therapy. Services can include intensive experiential skill building in group, individual, and family therapy. In addition to traditional mental health services, clinicians regularly provide consultation services to families and other agencies on various topics, and include parent education and early childhood mental health consultation. Referrals can be made by other social services agencies, the school district or by parents and families directly. Various programs offer financial and health care assistance to qualified individuals and their families. Programs include the following:

Medicaid: Provides medical coverage for pregnant women, newborns, people under 21, and nursing home patients. People eligible for ATAP and APA (except Interim Assistance) will receive coverage.

Alaska Temporary Assistance Program (ATAP): Provides cash to children and their families when their lives are disrupted by death, continued absence, unemployment or incapacity of one or both parents. A family's income must be below limits set by State law, and the family's resources must not exceed \$2000.

Food Stamps: Program is designed to promote general health and welfare of Alaskan households by raising the level of nutrition.

General Relief Assistance: Provides aid for rent, utilities, and other expenses with proof of immediate need.

Chronic and Acute Medical Care (CAMA): Limited medical coverage for people not eligible for Medicaid or any other health care program. Covered services include inpatient hospitalization, nursing home care, and pregnancy related medical services.

Heating Assistance: Helps pay home heating bills to home owners and renters. Applications accepted November 1st through April 30th each year.

Adult Public Assistance (APA): Provides cash assistance to adults who are either physically or mentally disabled, blind, or at least 65 years of age. Individuals are required to apply for Supplemental Security Income (SSI, contact Social Security Administration 225-5200, or 1-800-478-5199).
